



<p>5. Click on <b>Job Role Match for Holland Code</b> to see the <b>Matching Job Roles</b> for your Holland Code.</p>

**Job Role Description**

The Architect (Design Architect) plans, designs and leads the construction of buildings and other infrastructure. He/She helps prepare project details and drawings for the clients. He/She takes into account the needs of clients, purposes of construction and the clients' budgets. He/She advises the clients on project execution and oversees the quality and progress of work done. This includes arranging contracts between clients and builders. He/She also visits construction sites to ensure work is properly done. He/She discloses any problems. He/She keeps in contact with people from Government departments and private companies. He/She acts on behalf of the clients to contact other parties involved in the project.

He/She works alongside other professionals such as engineers or quantity surveyors. At times, overtime and weekend work may be needed to meet project deadlines.

**Tasks**

- Accountable for the clients' needs and purposes of construction.
- Advise the clients on project execution.
- Arrange contracts between clients and builders.
- Be responsible for the design of the building and the materials used.
- Help to ensure the building project meets the clients' budget.
- Oversee any construction problems that may occur, as well as connecting with people from Government departments and private companies.
- Oversee the progress and quality of the work on-site.
- Prepare project details and drawings for clients.
